HISTORIC BREVARD

Brevard County's Mosquito Control program began in earnest in June of 1947, with aerial spraying of insecticide in mosquito breeding areas using a fleet of four airplanes equipped with 75 gallon tanks. Subsequent years saw the expansion of this program by several more aircraft as well as spray-equipped trucks on the ground.
