Digital forensics is basically you use a Α Sure. set of scientific principles and procedures to extract evidence from an electronic device. It's my job to locate the evidence and then figure out a way to get it off that device in a court approved way.

Tell the jury what type of training and experience you have in this area.

I have about -- I'm an active member of United States Secret Service Electronic Evidence Task Force and with them about seven hundred hours of training, advanced training at the National Computer Forensics Institute in Hoover, Alabama.

Were you contacted for you involvement in this Q case by myself and Mr. McMaster?

Q What is contained on that disc?

A About a fourteen second clip of the shooting incident. The timeframe --

Q How did you produce that disc?

A Rather simply actually. I use a program called Adobe Premier Pro which is a video editing program, it's somewhat a photo shop but for videos. Basically I take a copy of the video you give me, I don't want to use the original, and upload it into the software and then very

simply go to the timeframe and segment that you want and very simply select it out, save it as a separate file and the export it and save it to a disc.

Q When you talk about slow it down, what do you ultimately produce from there?

A A slow motion video. It will be played at about half the speed, the normal speed. The video when it was recorded was recorded at twenty-five frames per second. A frame per second is basically a video with just a bunch of still pictures in a row. So, if it's twenty-five frames per seconds, in one second there's twenty-five still pictures, if that makes sense. I slowed the video down to twenty frames per second. So, it's just slowed down a little bit.

- Q And in any way did you alter the video in any manner?
 - A Not other than slowing it down, no.
- Q And in addition, did you make still photographs in this case, or still images?
 - A Yes.

- Q Did you produce or slow it down to the point of producing still images?
 - A Yes.
 - Q How were you able to do that?

Q Without showing them to the jury, do you recognize the photographs that are contained in there?

A These are still frame photographs of this.

This is the video format and this is it broken down into still pictures.

MR. BROWN: Your Honor, at this time the State would move each of those numbered exhibits into evidence as the next numbered State exhibits.

THE COURT: Okay. Response from the Defense.

MR. PIROLO: May we approach, Your Honor?

THE COURT: Yes, you may.

(Thereupon, a benchside conference was had out of the hearing of the audience as follows:)

MR. PIROLO: Judge, the proper predicate hasn't been laid. First of all, Detective Guillette's not able to say that's what captured on the video fairly and accurately depicts what occurred on March 6th, 2012, at the exact time. He wasn't present.

Same objections that we raised earlier on the Bryant, Wagner and Dolan that what he captured -- the image he captured is from a video camera from Deputy Pill's patrol car and there's never any evidence to properly authenticate that video as to the testing, maintenance of it and so forth.

As to the -- in addition, Judge, it's probative value is substantially outweighed by the unfair prejudice. The jury's already seen the video. The video's in evidence. This is just again appealing to the jurors emotions. It's going at it slower and slower in the last seconds that Deputy Pill was alive. It's just geared to her emotions.

And the same objections go for the photograph. There's a hundred and thirty-eight photographs and there are multiple duplicates of the same image. If you look -- if you examine the images, Your Honor, there's nothing that you can pick out from three, four at a time. There's about three or four images that the Court needs to look at them, it's going to take a while, it's a hundred and thirty-eight of them that it is the same image, it's just paused and it's again to be put in front of a juror's face to appeal to their emotions again the very last seconds that Deputy Pill was alive. There's, no probative value

for this whatsoever.

The jurors will be able to hook at the video if they want to as many times as they want during deliberations and that's what they should be able to look at, not these images that again this witness cannot say that it fairly and accurately depicts the events that happened at that time because he wasn't there. He's never examined the camera. There's no testimony that he examined the video camera in Deputy Pill's patrol car and he's never seen — there's no testimony that he viewed or was present when the SD card was taken out, that he downloaded these materials from the SD card, there's been absolutely no authentication or predicate laid for these items to come in.

THE COURT: Okay. Response from the State.

MR. BROWN: Judge, as far as the predicate, he's established what he's done, this is an duplicate, that these were altered the copy that what he was given in any manner, that he simply produced these images from that. The still images are the —there's a hundred and thirty-eight which is as he testified it's twenty-five images per second so we're talking about approximately six seconds of the actual video.

The slow motion video is a slow motion video without sound. So, we're not -- it doesn't produce 2 the gunshots. It allows the jury to see step by step exactly what happened, determine the number of shots, 4 which the number of shots is a key factor to premeditation. It addition, it allows them to 7 actually see what the shooter was doing and at one point you actually I believe tell that the shooter's 8 arm is black.

> They made a point of bringing out from the female witness that she could not observe who did the shooting or where the shooting came from. speed video moves at such a fast nature because this happened so quickly that it's hard to tell. gives the jury an opportunity to actually see it in a slow version. It's not overly prejudicial. no sound to it. This allows the jury to view it frame by frame with the still photographs or -- and view those along with viewing the slow motion video.

The frame (unintelligible) is MR. MCMASTER: different than each one of the (unintelligible) 000 to 137.

MR. PIROLO: Judge, if you look at those still photographs, there's about three four or to each segment that are the same. They're cumulative with

MR. PIROLO: If the Court's considering on getting those -- allowing those pictures to come in, I think they should be limited. All hundred and thirty-eight should not come in.

MR. BROWN: Judge, they're limited in that we only took these key seconds. We didn't have a still photograph of the entire incident. The still photographs we're using comprise of less than six seconds of the actual video.

MR. PIROLO: If the Court looks, they're about --

MR. BROWN: During which period you can see the arm coming up, the firing, the recoil, going back down, firing again, the recoil and it's things that you cannot see watching it in the normal speed and

that's the key reason behind this. We're only putting in the most relevant portion, the actual shooting, and this will allow the jury to watch it in the slow motion video with the pictures in hand.

THE COURT: The objection by the Defense is overruled.

BROWN: Your Honor, the State would call 14 Andria Kerchner. 15 16 THE COURT: Ma'am, if you'll step up before the 17 clerk to be sworn. 18 THEREUPON, 19 ANDRIA KERSCHNER, 20 having been first duly sworn, was examined and testified 21 upon her oath as follows: 22 THE COURT: Ma'am, if you'll please be seated in the witness chair. Did you ever see anything from the officer that indicated she was going to shoot? 10 Α No, sir.

Did the officer eventually walk up to the car?

Yes, sir, the whole time she was saying these orders she was walking up to the car.

in your mind? Answer: Yes, sir.

MR. BROWN: I'm going to object. May we approach?

THE COURT: Yes, you may.

(Thereupon, a benchside conference was had out of the hearing of the audience as follows:)

MR. BROWN: Judge, two basis. One, this has clearly been asked and answered a number of times and she's answered. Second, he's not at this point impeaching her. She's admitted all this and at some point the impeachment actually has to be ask the question, get an answer and then go to the prior statement and say this a conflict. So, that's actually what impeachment is which hasn't been done.

THE COURT: Okay. I don't think that the proper -- he didn't ask her if she remembered being asked that question.

MR. PIROLO: I'm sorry.

MR. BROWN: Even beyond that, he can't just say we've asked this question previously, he's got to get something in conflict to that and then say we were you previously asked this question.

MR. BROWN: She said her answer to that three times by my count that unless she can remember it specifically and place it she says she doesn't remember. If she can remember it specifically and place it, she's said that's what I've told today. She's given that three times.

THE COURT: My problem is that she hasn't -her response to that answer was everything I've told
here today I remember, otherwise I've said I don't
remember which isn't really in response to that
question, so.

MR. PIROLO: And I'm taking the question --

THE COURT: It's somewhat confusing.

MR. PIROLO: -- word for word from the deposition. It was asked it to her very clearly during the depo, she clearly understood what the question meant and she gave a very concise answer, yes, sir, she can't remember.
