HISTORIC BREVARD

In the lead-up to World War 2, the federal government looked for land on the east coast on which to place a naval air base. When it was learned that Merritt Island was one of the locations being considered, a delegation of county officials which included Ward Klingensmith, Lansing Gleason, and Carlos Canova, went to Washington D.C. to lobby for this area. When the Navy decided to place the facility here, the Banana River Naval Air Station was founded. By early 1940 the air station occupied 1750 acres on the barrier island east of Cocoa.
