located at 860 Camp Rd. Cocoa, Brevard County, Florida.

To reach the location of the vehicle one would begin at the intersection of U.S. 1 and Camp Road, Cocoa, Brevard County, Florida. From this intersection one would travel west on Camp Road for approximately (1.25) miles until reaching the entranceway to 860 Camp Rd. (Brevard County Jail and Fleet Maintenance facility). One would turn right (north) onto the access road to the Brevard County Jail and impound lot. The secured impound lot is located on the right (northeast) side of the Brevard County Jail complex.

The vehicle in question was occupied by suspects Brandon Lee Bradley (black male D.O.B 8-23-1989) and Andria Michelle Kerchner (white female D.O.B 5-31-1992) following a Robbery with a Deadly Weapon and the Murder of a Law Enforcement Officer. before the Court having jurisdiction of this offense to be used in the prosecution of persons violating this offense and thereafter to be disposed of according to law.
