THIS MATTER came before the Court on the Motion to Determine Confidentiality of Court Records filed by Petitioners, STEPHEN G. CHARPENTIER, ESQ., and JASON R. FRAXEDAS, ESQ., pursuant to Rule 2.420(c)(9), Florida Rule of Judicial Administration.

Petitioner seeks an Order determining the Confidentiality of the following documents relative to this civil action:

- A. Ex Parte Petition for Approval of Division of Attorneys' Fees.
- B. Order on Petition for Approval of Division of Attorneys' Fees.

Petitioners' Motion was not contested and a hearing was not conducted.

Having considered the arguments of the parties, legal authority and otherwise being fully advised in the premises, the Court Grants the Motion as follows:

1. The Ex Parte Petition for Approval of Division of Attorneys' Fees (including its attachments and/or exhibits thereto) and the Order on Petition for Approval Of Division of Attorneys' Fees are confidential.

- 2. There is no less restrictive measure available to protect these interests, and the degree, duration and manner of confidentiality ordered herein are no broader than necessary to protect the interests.
- 3. The Court has determined that those particular documents shall be sealed in their entirety within the Court file to keep such information from public access. However, the file and progress docket shall otherwise remain available to the public.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

- A. The Clerk of this Circuit Court is hereby directed to immediately treat as confidential the following documents related to this matter and shall keep such materials from public access:
 - a. The Petition for Approval of Division of Attorneys' Fees (including its attachments and/or exhibits thereto)
 - b. Order on Petition for Approval of Division of Attorneys' Fees. However, the file and progress docket shall otherwise remain available to the public.
- B. Any materials treated as confidential pursuant to this Order may be disclosed only as follows:
 - a. to any Judge of this Circuit for case-related reasons;
 - b. to the Chief Judge or his or her designee; or
 - c. to authorized government agencies; or
 - d. by further Order of the Court.
- C. Within ten (10) days of the date of this Order, the Clerk shall post a copy of this Order in a prominent public location in the Harry T. & Harriette V. Moore Justice Center, 2825 Judge Fran Jamieson Way, Viera, Florida, 32940, and on the Clerk's website for a period of thirty (30) days to provide public note.

D. The Clerk is hereby authorized to open any materials determined to be confidential pursuant to this Order for the purpose of filing, microfilming or imaging files, or transmitting a record to an appellate tribunal. The materials shall be treated as confidential immediately upon completion of the filing.

It is further ADJUDGED that within five days from the date of eservice of this Order/Judgment, the Petitioner shall: 1. Furnish a copy of this Order/Judgment to each self- represented party by U.S. Mail, first class, postage paid; and 2. File a certificate signed by Petitioner's counsel that delivery of this Order/Judgment has been made as set forth herein.
